- 2012**      **Museumwise Get Set Grant: \$3,000**  
Fund-raising consultant to organize Capital Campaign for Opendore project.
- 2011**      **Environmental Protection Grant: \$400,000**  
Grant to restore/revitalize Opendore— Isabel Howland House in Sherwood (via NYS OPRHP).  
50/50 match.
- 2011**      **National Trust for Historic Preservation Grant: \$5,000**  
Professional evaluation of Opendore, Isabel Howland House for future  
restoration/construction. 50/50 match.
- 2010**      **Museumwise Get Set Grant: \$2,990**  
Collections Management Grant
- 2009**      **Upstate History Alliance Get Set Grant: (now Museumwise): \$2,994**  
Strategic Planning Grant
- 2009**      **Member Item Grant, Assemblyman Gary Finch: \$5,000**

- 2008**      **National Park Service's (NPS) National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Grant  
program: \$25,000 award**  
50/50 match. Preservation/restoration of our cobblestone building; used to match NYS  
Heritage NY Grant. Also raised locally \$17,000 to complete project.
- 2007**      **Heritage NY: Preservation/restoration of Howland Stone Store Museum: \$36,750**  
75%/25% match. Cobblestone building preservation/restoration including significant  
structural and cobblestone repair, HVAC, some UV storm windows, handicap accessibility.
- 2006**      **Preserve NY (Preservation League of NYS): \$5,560**  
Our match was in-kind services; research, photographs, documentation. Consultant fees—  
Judy Wellman—to do the research necessary and then draft a nomination for the *Hamlet of*

*Sherwood* for the National Register. This was listed as the Sherwood Equal Rights Historic District on the state and National registers.

**2006 Emerson Foundation: \$2,500 gift**

This was to be part of our match for Heritage NY grant.

**2005 Lower Hudson Conservation Treatment Grant— for UGRR ticket: \$710**

We had to pay fees for evaluation of item as part of application process, and then for framing of ticket once restored.

Repair on Shed. HSSM did provide \$2000 for this project

**2002 Cayuga Community College Foundation: \$2,000**

Grant for services of Mary Ann Felter and Dan Schultz (faculty members at CCC) to research and catalog Poster collection. Grant paid directly to researchers. No match, but in-kind services provided.
